

Colonial Day Craft Vendor-2014

Rules and Regulations

The following rules and regulations have been established to insure the safety and promote the enjoyment of all the patrons of Colonial Day and help make sure it is a positive and profitable day for all our vendors, exhibitors and customers.

1. **Exhibitors may sell only art or crafts they have made. Absolutely no imports may be displayed or sold.** The wares must reflect the skills, arts, and/or crafts of the early American period. No objects may be made from commercial kits.

*****No plastic or similar materials may be used in the products sold.*****

2. All exhibitors are strongly encouraged to wear colonial dress. This is an important point in continuing to draw large numbers of visitors.

3. The official Colonial Day booth sign must be prominently displayed in the front of the booth.

4. No drawing or raffle activity shall be conducted in the booth.

5. No pets are allowed.

6. Sidewalks must be kept clear three feet on the building side.

7. All displays must be confined to the assigned area and in no way obstruct neighboring booths or endanger the public.

8. Exhibitors cannot assign, sublet, or permit use by others, in whole or in part, of the space assigned to them.

9. No "bargain sale" signage ("50% off", "closeout", etc.) permitted.

10. **Canopies over booths must be plain white fabric.**

Inspections: Jury members will inspect each booth during Colonial Day to check on compliance with the requirements above, with particular emphasis on item 1. Descriptions and photos submitted with applications must be clear representations of the wares in each booth; vendors will need to remove unapproved items. If any violations of these rules and regulations cannot be resolved with EBHPS representatives, the vendor may be asked to remove the booth and no refund will be given.
